

Father Bowen Appointed Vice Postulator By Sister Virginie Fish, O.S.P.

The Oblate Sisters of Providence had petitioned the Local Ordinary, Archbishop
William Keeler to open the investigation into the life of heroic virtue and charitable deeds of Mother Mary

[Elizabeth] Lange. Sister Mary Alice was Superior General of the Congregation. Informed that the Diocesan Postulator is appointed by the "petitioner" with the approval of the Bishop, without hesitation she appointed Father John Bowen, S.S. It was February 16, 1990.

Fr. John Bowen, Sulpician Archivist had served as Oblate chaplain for more then two decade. It was considered the ideal appointment. Fr. Bowen, unassuming, deeply spiritual, faithful, knowledgeable and with the "patience of Job" accepted this responsibility with alacrity. He fulfilled this task to its conclusion at the Archdiocesan level when the documents were sent by Cardinal Keeler to Rome in 2004. Fr. Bowen's task was now complete; he was no

longer postulator for the cause for canonization of Mother Mary Lange. He could devote more time to fulfilling the great demands of his priestly ministry: celebrating liturgy, hearing confessions, ministering to the sick, dying and dead. Then, "the other shoe dropped."

The postulator at the Vatican, Fr. Wieslaw Spiewak, C.R., appointed Fr. Bowen to serve as assistant to him as Vice Postulator for the cause. Fr. Bowen, true to his nature, man of God, man of service, never one to refuse, bowed his head in acceptance and obedience to the will of God.

Congratulations, Fr. Bowen. With admiration and appreciation for your dedication and faithfulness, all involved in this effort pledge prayer support and cooperation. The cause for canonization of Servant of God Mary Lange will take wings because your humility and acquiescence is sure to win the favor of God.
