# RECOMMITMENT SERVICE

Saturday, May 14, 2011

Saturday May 14, 2011 was a dreary day, but that did not dampen the spirit of the men and women who attended this service to reaffirm their commitment to promoting the cause for canonization of Mother Mary Lange.

Sister Alexis Fisher's welcoming remarks were received with applause. She pointed out that in June 2009 the Oblate Sisters of Providence voted on an official picture of Mother Lange. Also when we recommit ourselves to promoting the Cause for her canonization, she should be addressed as Mother Mary Lange and not Mother Mary Elizabeth Lange. She urged us all to "ask God to gift us with just

a portion of Mother Lange's commitment, patience, fidelity and courage".

Our Presider Father John C. Kemper, SS, Director of St. Mary's Visitor Center, located in downtown Baltimore on Paca Street spoke from the heart and stated in his talk, that Mother Lange was a good servant of the Lord.

Mrs. Therese Wilson Favors, the president of the Mother Lange Guild Board of Directors, introduced the board members as well as the Ex officio members and recognized the different chapters by calling out their names which are as follows:

Next, Therese introduced the new members who officially accepted to join the Guild Board of Directors in September at the start of our new fiscal year. They are: Father John C. Kemper, SS, Dr. Camille Brown, Mrs. Jocelyn Alexander, Ms. Nadine Shepherd, and Rev. Mr. Al Turner. She invited at this time the chapter members and other volunteers to renew their commitment to work hand in hand with the National Board of the Mother Mary Lange Guild to promote the cause of Mother Mary Lange.

This was followed by the presentations of the chapters Therese invited Mrs. Carole Depestre to read a text written by Max Auguste on behalf of his chapter, "The Will of God"; Due to unforeseen circumstances, none of the members were able to attend the service. It is worth noting that this fairly new chapter (they just celebrated their first year anniversary) has been very active in promoting the cause for the canonization of Mother Mary Lange. doubling the number of their membership, writing their by laws, celebrating their first anniversary and collecting almost as much money for their "Just a buck a month drive" as the previous year.

Two other chapters worth noting for their activities during the past year are 1) the Mother Mary Lange York, PA, Chapter; their Chair, Mrs. KathleenStayman, reported offering the Mother Mary Lange's prayer cards at the Pro-Life booth at the York, PA, Fair back in September 2010. They also sent copies of Mother Mary Lange cards to Eucharist ministers at three parishes. They are planning to have Mother Mary Lange's informationat St. Patrick's Heritage Festival on May 22, 2011 and will investigate avenues to raise funds among other things. 2) Mrs. Loretta Dove, chair-person for the Chapter of St. Peter Claver, spoke of their accomplishments which include: monthly meetings, giving out MML prayer cards and rosaries to parishioners and visitors, reciting the rosary every Wednesday and praying for the canonization of Mother Mary Lange, holding a bake sale to benefit the Mother Mary Lange Guild and donating money to the Guild on the anniversary of the death of Mother Mary Lange and the Re-Commitment service. Finally, with great enthusiasm she reported that on June 18th the Oblate Sisters of Providence will be honored at their Juneteenth celebration in Southern Maryland. The Oblate Sisters of Providence will be awarded the "Pioneer in History Award." She also mentioned that she's going to have that day proclaimed "Mother Mary Lange Day." In addition, they will have a booth where they will distribute the M.L. cards, pins and other items.

Next, Mrs. Marie Washington, one of the members of Mother Mary Lange Gift of Providence from St. Veronica in Baltimore, said a few words. She was followed by Carole Depestre of HAU who offered a donation on behalf of the chapter.

Finally Sister Magdala Marie, OSP the director of Mother Mary Lange Guild concluded the service with a few remarks. The service ended with the recitation of the prayer for the beatification of Mother Mary Lange.

opportunity to share the prayer card and information about Mother Lange's story. Education was her mission and knowledge is power.

I always have a pamphlet about the Oblate Sisters of Providence on my person. People, who know the history of the United States, always question whether it was illegal when the process to educate black children begun. Illegal to educate children of color because knowledge is power. ".... prejudice and racial hatred never blurred that vision."

The Guild presently sends its newsletter to many people in various states in America and to various countries. We need to reinforce our efforts to reach more persons in other countries and in the states. This could also work as a two-fold benefit for the Sisters – 1) increasing knowledge of Mother Lange and 2) providing an outlet for vocations, (not to mention the upstart of newer chapter formations). What is a chapter? It is a group of persons committed to the cause in educating communities about Mother Lange. It creates programs to foster prayer and sharing. Again, knowledge is power.

To have Mother Lange canonize is like seeing the first U. S. President of color and the first U. S. national monument to a person of color. Yes, it's time for the first U.S. women religious of color to celebrate their Founder as a saint. We can and will continue to do our part!




# African American Heritage Festival

The Unified Committee for African American Contributions recognized Mother Mary Lange and the Oblate Sisters during their Eighth Annual Juneteenth Celebration held in Lexington Park, Maryland. This "Pioneer in History Award" is presented to the individuals and/or for organizations whose contributions to country, state and nation spans over a decade and have had a positive impact upon the African American Community and the community at large. Since the Oblate Sisters of Providence educated the youth of St. Mary's County for over forty years they easily met these qualifications.

The Juneteenth Celebration marks the day in 1865, almost two and a half years after the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation, when the slaves of Galveston, Texas were finally notified of their freedom.

Juneteenth is widely celebrated across the country on June 19th as a day in recognition of the emancipation of slaves: their freedom and the human rights that all people in the United States of America enjoy.
